The following resolutions were submitted and accepted by its members:

#1 Case annualize a pre-conference provincial/territorial network summit in conjunction with the annual CASE conference (this was the summit meeting that Mylaine and I attended).

#2 CASE in consultation with participating provincial networks, develop a research proposal to submit to a federal body to undertake a policy survey research initiative on enabling and disabling employment support policies for people with disabilities.

#3 CASE build its organizational capacity by:

- A) finding resources to hire staff, and engage in partnerships, and
- B) engaging in partnerships to conduct its work.

These resolutions are a reflection of the vision, commitment and drive of the executive board of the Canadian Association for supported employment.
